Lockridge Medical Centre - Satellite Clinic

From early this term, we have a Lockridge Medical Centre satellite clinic starting on-site at LPS each Tuesday. This opportunity has arisen through our strong relationships within our community and will provide First Nation and medically at risk students and family members the opportunity to attend an appointment with a nurse practitioner. The aims of the clinic are:

- Acute care for illnesses and injuries;
- Management of chronic conditions like asthma or diabetes:
- Routine physicals;
- Immunisations:
- Dressings;
- Prescriptions (no Schedule A medications)

This is a very exciting development for our overall student and family well-being endeavours, and we look forward to seeing the benefits that such a service will provide.


