PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Term 3 to date has been a positive one at LPS, with a range of activities and event enriching the education of our students. The **School Council** spearheading our nomination in the WA Education Awards and the **P&C** Take-out Days and Father's Day Stall have been great examples how our families play a positive role in our school.

Although we celebrate many good things, we also have to confront challenges, with one of the biggest in our community being **online safety**. Much time is going into supporting students in this space, yet, we regularly field concerns from families about online behaviour on apps like Snapchat and Discord. I appreciate that these apps may be unknown to us 'older folk', but it is our responsibility to know the dangers.

We have even been gathering some informal data and have found that a large number of our students have access to websites, apps or content that are not intended for them. We also found a number of students have experienced communication or imagery that made them uncomfortable, with only a handful having told their parents/carers.

We must work together on this and sometimes make hard decisions, to keep our kids safe online. This includes limiting screen access to times when adults are present, turning off the wifi, setting time limits for activities like gaming and, if necessary, taking the device away entirely. We need to remember, we are the adults, and it's our responsibility to help keep our kids safe online.




FROM OUR AEIO...


