STRENGTHENING OUR SCHOOL

There are changes coming to the way schools across WA report student progress and achievement, in line with the new guidelines set by the Department of Education.

Starting this semester, the reports will now include only general comments, not any learning area comments (such as English, Mathematics, Drama, Physical Education, Auslan etc...)

Fortunately, we don't see a major impact on how we communicate student success or challenges, despite this change, as other formats of reporting, including Student Progress Meetings, Individual Education Plan meetings, Seesaw communication and regular informal meetings or phone conversations are well established at LPS.

Please rest assured that if your child is not meeting the expected standards in any area, you will have already been contacted by their classroom teacher prior to the reports being issued. Our goal remains to ensure you are fully informed of your child's progress, and we will continue to reach out to discuss any achievements, concerns or areas that may require support.

Connected Practice - Pedagogical Commitment


FROM OUR AEIO...


Please note due to uniform supplier increases, we have had to increase some uniforms items.


